### Wins Promotion At Ethyl Corp.

**Offer Classes For Expectant Parents In Area**

How many diapers shall I buy? What does it mean when the mother is Rh negative and the father Rh positive? How do you know when a baby is hungry?

Questions like these are commonly raised in classes for Expectant Parents. The classes are conducted by public health nurses and are sponsored by the Oakland County Medical Society, the Oakland County Department of Health, Pontiac City Department of Health and various Adult Education Departments.

Expectant Parents' Classes offer an opportunity for parents to gain knowledge and understanding that will help to increase their enjoyment in this experience and will prepare them to give care when baby arrives. The first four classes are centered around the mother. There is ample opportunity for discussions of family adjustments, growth and development of the baby before birth and labor and delivery. The last four classes will cover feeding of the baby, what the next baby is like and baby's first year.

Audio visual aids are used to supplement discussion and conducted hospital tours are arranged during classes.
