

### Homestead House Plans Ethan Allen Festival Sept. 9-14

Beginning September 9 and running until September 14, Homestead House, located on Grand River Avenue in Farmington, will be the scene of a colorful as well as educational "Ethan Allen Festival," held in conjunction with the presentation of the Ethan Allen collection of early colonial days and in particular around Ethan Allen, one of the most courageous and picturesque figures of the American Revolution. Allen was the famous Vermont patriot and Revolutionary War officer who, with his "Green Mountain Boys," took the napping British by surprise one quiet night in May of 1775 and captured Fort Ticonderoga from the Redcoats.

Through the courtesy of the Fort Ticonderoga Museum, the store will exhibit an array of authentic colonial relics. Free booklets about the fort will be distributed as souvenirs. Window and floor displays will depict the atmosphere of the pioneer days when the women wore calico and churched their own butter, and the menfolk sported knee-breeches and powdered wigs.

In addition to the cultural display, the store will present a broad series of diversified displays of Early American furniture, including a variety of authentic colonial relics. Free booklets about the fort will be distributed as souvenirs.

There will also be free gifts to all adults as well as a grand prize at the end of the "Ethan Allen Festival."

Dear Sirs: Anyone seeking or enjoying an elective office in our form of government expects some time or other to hear many things about himself. It is one of the prices of Public Service. If he is sincere, he ignores the comments for the simple reason that he is much too engrossed with his responsibilities to dredge remarks that stem from misinformation of from rabid politicians.

As many of you know, I have worked with my husband for several years. When Clayton was elected for the first time as Treasurer, it was the policy of the Township that the officials pay their help from their salary. The Treasurer preceding my husband had found it impossible, and find you this was in 1941, to do the work alone, and also difficult to pay skilled help from his salary. When Clayton became Treasurer, we solved the problem by my doing his clerical work. Clayton had been your Highway Commissioner for several years, and had a lucrative business before the depression, so with a familiarity of property descriptions, and a business acumen, was well qualified for the work.

Like Topsy, I grew with the job. But, only the mis-informed, now in 1957, would contend that a Township doing approximately one and one quarter Million Dollars of business a year, all passing through the Treasurer's office, could be handled by one person.
