Tells Of Jehovah's Roundup Of State Fair Activities Witnesses Being Persecuted

Ten American missionaries were deported to Puerto Rico from the Dominican Republic August 3, De Loss Ludwig, president minister of the Farmington Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, announced this week. Fare was paid by the Dominican government and the missionaries were escorted under arrest to the plane.

Grand Opening Day, Friday, August 30, will feature the opening day parade in downtown Detroit at 11 a.m. Admission to the Fair grounds is free until noon on opening day, Swanson, announced.

Saturday, August 31, is Veterans' Day. All Veterans are admitted free and an outstanding program has been arranged in cooperation with the Consolidated War Veterans Councils of Michigan. Events scheduled include drum and bugle corps, rifle squad and drill teams, memorial ceremonies and band concerts given by State champion Red Arrow 32nd Division and the Charles L. Young A.D. 71, of Detroit.

There will be repeat of the popular Sunrise Service on Sunday, September 1, at 8 a.m. The speaker will be Bishop Gerald H. Kennedy, resident bishop of Los Angeles area Methodist Church. Visitors attending the service, which is sponsored by the Detroit Council of Churches, will be admitted free to the Fairgrounds between 7 and 8 a.m. and may remain for the entire day.

Many contests on Children's Day, Tuesday, September 3, will be held at the Grandstand. In addition to pie eating and pony tail contests, there'll be balloon bursting and page staking this year.

A continuous program has been arranged for Old Times' Day, Thursday, September 5, in the Music Shell. There'll be cash awards for the baldest head, oldest woman, oldest man, prettiest hat, longest mustache and the longest married couple. Special fashion shows, concerts, and dance revues of particular interest to the older citizens will be held.

Saturday, September 7, will be Teachers' Day when the State Fair will honor Michigan teachers and educators with awards for their notable contributions during the past year. All Michigan teachers will be entertained free.

Tipnotch entertainers will perform on Tuesday, September 3, and he (three shows daily: 3 p.m., 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. The first weekend, August 30 through September 2, will headline Eddie Goetz, Johnnie Ray, Bill Haley and his Comets, plus many other acts.

Following the livestock showing and judging and the Evening Farm Fun Frolies on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, The Coliseum entertainment for the closing week, September 6, 7 and 8, will feature Georgia Gibbs, Guy Mitchell, Fontaine Sisters, the Mirels, and a host of others.

Rio Tin Tin with Lt. Rip Masters and Rusty will appear in person in the Grandstand from August 30 through September 6. There will also be other movie stars and musical stars, stunt horses and racing mules. Leo Carillo will be an added attraction on September 3, 4 and 5.

For the auto race fans, the Grandstand will present three classes: A 100-mile mixed championship on Saturday, September 7, and a 150-mile mixed championship on Sunday, September 8.

Running throughout the Fair will be a continuous program of free entertainment in the Music Shell and Old Times' Grove, free cooking schools, hand concerts, dance revues, specialty acts and hundreds of educational, industrial and agricultural exhibits.

Fluoride Treat Teeth Of 185,000 In Ten Years

Approximately 185,000 Michigan youngsters from the ages of 3 to 13 years inclusive have had fluoride solution painted on their teeth during the 10 summers since 1948 that topical fluoride application programs have been offered in this state.

The Michigan Department of Health announced the 10-year total recently as the 10th annual program neared its end. About 35,000 children received fluoride applications this summer. The applications were given this year at 173 centers in 45 counties by 19 senior dental students and 40 dental hygiene students from the University of Michigan and the University of Detroit.

Topical fluoride applications reduce tooth decay in children by 40 per cent, the State Health Department said. This method of reducing decay is second in effectiveness only to fluoridated water, the department explained. Water fluoridation reduces tooth decay by approximately 60 per cent.

Local dentists supervise each application centered in the summer program in cooperation with local health departments. The state health department has general supervision of the program and orients the staff.
