Consumers' Hopes To Add 20,000 Heat Customers

Consumers Power Company re-
cently requested the Michigan Pub-
lic Service Commission to approve
the connecting of 20,000 additional
gas space heating customers.

Consumers, which supplies gas
service to 22 cities, villages and
townships in 29 Michigan counties,
has about 180,000 unfilled appli-
cations for gas space heating ser-
vice at this time, officials stated.

Don E. Karn, president of the
company, said Consumers' petition
for authority to connect 20,000 ad-
ditional space heating customers
is based on an agreement for the
purchase by Consumers of the gas
wells in the Overisel Gas Field in
Allegan County.

"This will relieve the present
shortage of gas in the company's
service area, but only to a minor
extent," Karn said. "It will be a
case of connecting those gas space
heating applicants who have been
waiting longest."

"We are continuing our efforts
to obtain larger additional supplies
of gas from the fields in the West-
ern States."

The Overisel Field is in Overisel
Township, Allegan County, about
seven miles Southeast of Holland.
It includes 38 producing wells.

The purchase agreement covers
all wells in the field, which con-
tains approximately 6,000 acres.
The wells are owned by the Taggart
Company of Big Rapids. The
annual transfer of ownership is ex-
pected to become effective within
the next few months.

Consumers plans to build a 12-
inch pipeline from the field to the
east side of Kalamazoo, giving that
city a second source of gas supply.
Use of Overisel gas in the Kalamazoo
area will release other gas for
use elsewhere in the 29 counties
where Consumers supplies gas service.

Swainson, a young lawyer, is a
strong possibility.

The State's Fight against alco-
holism reached new high points
this year.

Under the state board of alco-
holism, two professional workers
operate the program on a budget
just less than \$400,000 a year, us-
ing cooperation with local govern-
ment as the main power.

Achievements last year show
that more than 3,000 people heard
talks given by the two workers,
and members of a speakers bureau
gave 31 speeches to 8,493 people.

Special reports on alcoholism
were sent to 3,169 physicians, 688
hospitals, and 383 public libraries.
Fifty scholarships were awarded
to schools of alcoholic studies.
Movies have been provided.

Under the treatment program,
268 alcoholics received in-patient
care and 190 out-patient care at
the Grand Rapids Alcoholism Re-
habilitation Center, which the state
helps finance.

The Jackson Information Center
gave counseling and medical ser-
vices to 104 alcoholics and 374 new
patients received help from the
Detroit Mayor's Committee on
Sick Road Problems.

Pontiac and Highland Park open-
ed information centers and 10
other communities started alcohol-
ism programs.

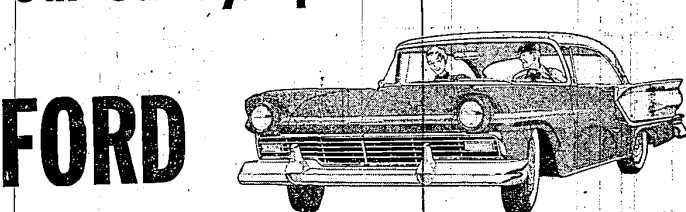
