Carried, 4 years, 2 days, Hug and Stephenson.
The following resolution was presented by Brown and supported by Avery:
Resolved: That no expenditure of money of this Township shall or may be made, after August 27, 1957, other than in the regular course of Township business and in the regular operation of the affairs of this Township, nor shall any debts be incurred other than in the regular course of Township business, until the annual budget presented at the last annual Township meeting has been duly adopted by the Board, and the amounts thereof which have been obligated and/or expended since the last annual Township meeting, and the amounts thereof have been determined.
