

Ship Michigan Squirrels To Canada as Experiment

Thirty - one Michigan fox squirrels recently established residence in Canada as part of a cooperative game program involving Conservation Departments in Michigan and Ontario.

The squirrels were live-trapped on woodlots at Michigan State University by game workers from the Michigan Conservation department's Rose Lake wildlife experiment station.

The animals were then shipped to Ontario and released; at Port Franks, near Sarnia, where Ontario game specialists hope to establish squirrel populations.

This cooperative game program with Ontario also has brought Hungarian partridge and pine martens from Canada in recent years for release in Michigan.
