

# Woodcock Hunting Season Dates Set.

The woodcock hunting season in the upper peninsula this fall will be October 1 - November 9.

In Zone 2 (the lower peninsula north of highway M-20), the woodcock season also will be October 1 - November 9. The birds will be legal game in Zone 3 (the lower peninsula south of highway M-20) during the October 2-November 9 season.

In Zones 2 and 3, hunting is not permitted on October 21 before 10 a.m.

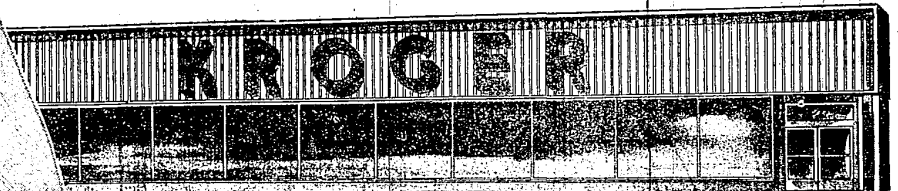
