## Fall Shrubbery Planting Tips

Fall evergreen and shrub planting time is upon us according to Fred B. Widmeyer, horticulture specialist at Michigan State University. Planting can start now and continue until the ground freezes.

Shrubs should be pruned about one third, if it has not already been done by the nursery, except in the case of rhododendrons, azaleas and dwarf type shrubs which should be lightly pruned. The new growth is all that should be trimmed from evergreens.

The easy way to figure out where one wants the shrubs is on paper, not by moving the plants all over the yard two or three times, Widmeyer said.

After marking where you want the plants, dig the holes large enough so that there will be at least four inches all the way around the plant and deep enough so that the plant will be the same depth as it grew in the nursery row.

Leave the burlap in place and fill in around the plant with good garden soil.

A water soluble fertilizer of 15-30-30 grade is commonly used for transplanting. Three tablespoons to a gallon of water produces a good starter solution.

A pint of the starter solution is enough for a small plant while a large shrub will require a quart. Add this starter fertilizer to the water used to settle the soil around the plant.

Be sure the new shrubs get an inch of water every week, either as rain or by irrigation.

## F.H.S. Band To Take Part In Mass Band Performance At U.M. Oct. 5

The Farmington High School Band will be among a group of 100 high school bands from throughout Michigan taking part in the massive half-time program planned for the University of Michigan-University of Georgia football game to be played at Ann Arbor Saturday, October 5. This will be the largest massed band ever assembled anywhere in the world, U. of M. officials indicated. A combined membership of 12,000 band players are expected to participate.

The event, ninth of the University's annual Band Days, will be sponsored by the U-M Bands and Athletic Association. This year some 800 twirlers from the participating bands will give a pregame exhibition.

Detailed instructions on music, marching, and rehearsals were forwarded local band directors almost a year ago. With careful advance preparation in their home communities, the bands will rehearse together only an hour Saturday morning prior to their performance.

## U.M. To Offer Twenty Bus. Ad. Classes In Area

In response to heavy demand, The University of Michigan Extension Service plans to offer 20 classes in business administration this fall in the metropolitan Detroit area. In addition, there will be seven courses in insurance and six in real estate.

All courses will be given at the Rookham Educational Memorial. Of the 20 business administration courses, 17 carry residence credit toward advanced degrees in this field. Virtually all are taught by members of the regular faculty of the U-M School of Business Administration. Most are three hour courses.

No limit has been placed by the School of Business Administration on the amount of work that may be taken in Detroit toward a graduate degree. In contrast, the amount of undergraduate work that may be done here is distinctly limited.

Among the credit courses which open the week of September 23 are "Principles of Accounting," "Money and Banking," "Business Law," "Report Writing," "Federal Income Tax Procedure," "Statistical Method Electronic Data Processing System," and "Office Management Principles."

Other credit courses are "Production Management," "Personnel Administration," "Management Relations," "Marketing Principles and Policies," "Investment Fundamentals and Working Capital Management." Completing the list are "Business History," "Advanced Cost Accounting," and "Sales Management."

A special course, "Management Accounting for Executives," will also be given, but this carries no academic credit. Details may be obtained from the Detroit Center. An advisor from the School of Business Administration will be in the Detroit Center during the afternoon and evening of Thursday and Friday, September 19 and 20. Persons who are interested in beginning a degree program in this field, as well as students who are already enrolled in the program, may talk with this advisor by appointment.

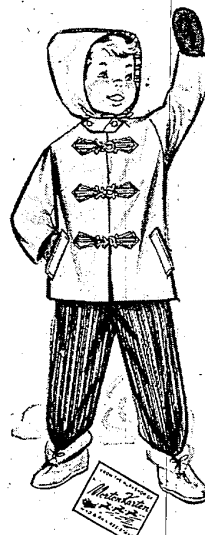
