(Continued from Page 1A) approval from Oakland County Drain Commission. NOMINATION of Robert Schulkins to the board of review, to fill the vacancy caused by resignation of William Fisher to the township board, was proposed by Supr. Stephenson. Schulkins is a former review board member who resigned to be an unsuccessful candidate for township board member.

In a parliamentary hassle the other five members of the board outvoted Stephenson and Hug and tabled the appointment until the next meeting. Westlake pointed out the board of review duties don't begin until March 1.

TOWNSHIPS have the power to operate subdivision water supply or sewage systems, the state at present general has ruled.

A letter from Harold K. Schone, head of the new Oakland County Dept. of Public Works, expressed willingness to take over sewage and water operations in Kendallwood and Westbrook Manor subdivisions. He said the state health dept. is reluctant to have private parties operate such systems.

Another letter from Michigan Dept. of Health apparently agreed with this information. Wendell Brown offered a motion which was passed that there be a conference with Schone at the earliest possible time.

There is always the possibility the township will want to operate these systems, of course.

APPROVAL of the proposal to delete lots 28 through 36 in a proposed special assessment district was given. These lots may tie directly into the proposed Farmington sewer interceptor.

John S. Drury, township inspector, was asked to present a claim for three weeks worked without pay while his wage scale was being set up.

THE TOWNSHIP attorney, Arthur L. Robbins, gave his opinion on several questions, including powers of the township board over appointed personnel.

Clarenceville To Start Exchange

Already started is the exchange of land in the Clarenceville School District approved last week in a light vote at a special election. The process is now in the hands of the school attorney.

The two parcels of land involved are adjacent to Botsford Elementary school. The school will enter into a formal agreement with Practical Home Builders, under which the school gives Practical Home Builders a parcel of land approximately 80,000 feet along the north side of Botsford school property.

In exchange the school gets a parcel approximately 500,000 feet adjacent to the west side of the property. This will permit access to the Botsford school property from the west.

Supl. Louis Schmidt said this week the school was taking action immediately to execute transfer of the building, site and equipment funds, also authorized in the recent election.

was expressly prescribed by statute, the right of the township board to control such appointments was unquestioned. He said also the township board has the right to control, classification of status, degree of duties and discharge of such employees. Since the supply of vaccine is limited and injections will be given on a first-come, first-served basis, those wishing assurance of receiving a shot are advised to come early.
