

# Governor Proclaims Women Voters Week September 13th

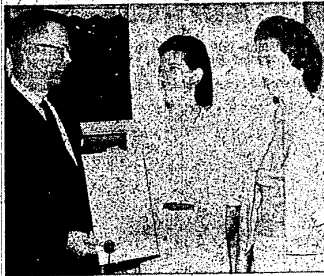
## Farmington Provisional Group Urges Registration

The week of Sept. 13th. has been proclaimed as National Women Voters Week by President Johnson. Proclaiming "the maximum participation of our citizens in the elective process is a basic need for the development of our democracy."

The week of September 13th has also been proclaimed as Michigan Voters Week by Governor Romney.

The Prov. League doesn't really need an officially designated "week" to impress upon Farmington citizens either its existence or its impact.

The League here and elsewhere throughout the nation performs an immensely constructive service in encouraging



not only the exercise of the vote but the exercise of an informed vote. Citizenship begins in the polling booth.

The League of Women Voters—that league for good government without party affiliations—is working hard at the moment in the city and township to encourage voters registration. "Your Vote Makes A Difference."

The immediate aim of Women Voters Week is to get more women registered and pledged to vote but its long-term aim is to provide the informed and active participation of citizens in government.

Women Voters Week has had the enthusiastic endorsement of both political parties.

Howard P. Marshall, President, Bank of Commerce and Wealth, Detroit, stated, "Through the ballot, we hope to preserve our liberty—the American way of life. For this purpose, it is the most effective procedure that we possess, perhaps the only one. The League of Women Voters promotes education and urges our use of the right of the ballot. This action is praise-worthy and should be supported to the utmost."

Also quoted from Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson: "Much of President Johnson's own determination to give women a break in government stems in part from your organization and its work."

Report of the President's Commission on Voting and Registration Participation: "The League of Women Voters in many states has taken the lead in disseminating information about the electoral system and about particular campaigns and candidates. We look forward to the continuation and expansion of the League's activities, and urge all women's organizations to engage actively in similar and cooperative programs."
