State Highway Dept. Plans Work-Training Program

The State Highway Department is prepared to conduct a work-training program for 400 men under provisions of the recently-enacted national Economic Opportunity Act.

At the same time, the Highway Department is prepared to expand its Student Highway Technician Training Program as part of the "War-on-Poverty" program recently adopted by Congress.

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie, in a letter to Gov. George Romney, said the program could utilize up to 400 young men and would be designed to give them training in forestry work and could lead to careers in this field.

"On the basis of preliminary estimates, there are about 100 miles of freeways (in northern Michigan) that could serve as the training ground for these young people — if finances

were made available for the administration of such a program," Mackie told Romney.

Mackie said that this work experience plus the related educational program would be of direct benefit to the health and well-being of the trainees.

At the same time, it would help prepare the youthful trainees for careers in such work as soil conservation, erosion control, forest management, roadside development and other related careers.

Development of such a program in Michigan would be able to accelerate its efforts to beautify Michigan's freeways, Mackie said.

Mackie told the Governor the State Highway Department has been conducting a Student Highway Technician Training Program on a cooperative basis with Lansing Community College since 1957 and with Ferris State College since 1960.

expanded to accommodate many more students if funds were available, Mackie said.

There is a continuing need, not only in the State Highway Department, but in local road agencies as well, for men with this training, and expansion of the program could help meet this need, he said.
