

# Artist From Area Plays Detroit Art Institute

Pianist James Tocco will play the works of Beethoven, Ravel, Bartok and Brahms; recital tonight Sept. 23, 8:30 p. m., at the Detroit Institute of Arts Auditorium.

Tocco, who made a memorable debut presentation in Detroit a year ago, has been studying at the Magda Tagliaferro School in Paris, France, since last October. Late in May of this year he climaxed his first year of study in Paris by winning first prize in the 7th Annual Magda Tagliaferro International Competition against 18 other contestants representing eleven countries.

Early next month, James returns to Paris for another year to study with the renowned European pianist and teacher, Magda Tagliaferro, and to meet the commitments of performing about eight or nine concerts throughout France which are, in part, the result of his winning the Paris competition.

He is a former student of Royal Oak pianist and teacher Boris Maximovich with whom he has studied for eight years. Since winning the Grinnel Piano Award in 1962, he has been performing in the Detroit area and Southern Michigan with distinction having made guest appearances with the Detroit Scandinavian, Grosse Pointe, Allen Park and Plymouth Symphonies.

His numerous concerts have

included recitals for the Cranbrook Music Guild, Pontiac Tuesday Musicale Club, St. Joseph Monday Music Guild, Michigan Federation of Music Clubs Convention, and the Palestrina Institute to name a few.

Tocco's early education included eight years of school at St. Catherine's Elementary School and four years at Austin High. From the latter he graduated with highest honors and ranked first in his class. He has completed two years of study at Wayne State University, and he is currently beginning the second year of his Sabbathal leave from that institution.

Proceeds from the recital will aid James to continue his study abroad for another year. Tickets will also be available at the box office.
