The 11th season of live theater has been announced by the Theatre Guild of Livonia-Redford which will open Oct. 23 with the readings of "The Fourposter".

Mrs. Beverly Green, Membership Director announced that season tickets are now available. "A season ticket entitles the person to attend all shows for the season on any night of the performance," Mrs. Green stated. "In addition a couple saves 20 percent on the price of the individual tickets, which is a remarkable saving for live theater right in your own backyard. The Guild also offers an active membership for those who just would like to meet people and enjoy the many phases of the mystery of backstage community theater."

Mrs. Pat Secor, Executive Director, in announcing the season stated that the additional show this year now makes available to the area the most complete program ever presented by the Guild and should prove very exciting for the area. The season opens Oct. 23rd at Redford Union with the readings of "The Fourposter", directed by Shirley Hulet and starring Maya Tourmeur and Charles Noel. The performance runs for one night only and will be followed by a tea and reception. On Nov. 27, 28, Dec. 4, 5 and 6 the Guild will present their fourth musical, this year, the sprightly musical "Bye, Bye Birdie." The musical is directed by Shirley Haveland with Jack Pierson as musical director and B. J. Scholtz, choreographer. This production has a cast of over one hundred with full orchestra and will be staged at Redford High. During the winter months the original Colette's "Gigi" will be staged at Redford Union High, directed by Betsy Savage. The dates have been set for Feb. 26 and 27. From March 5 through April 10 the Guild will present their 8th Annual Children's Show through-out Livonia and Redford. The Spring Production "Mary, Mary" will be presented (pending release) April 22 and 24 at Franklin High under the direction of Charles Noel.

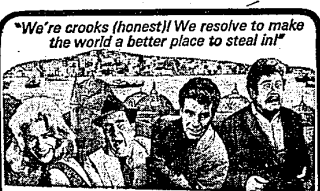
Curtain Going Up . . . WALLY ROBERTS

Mother Nature presently is engaged in providing gorgeous scenery for those fortunate enough to take a trip or two up to the Northern parts of our fair state. Golden yellows pervaded even so slightly with rosy reds peek modestly at us wherever we most are lucky enough to have a grove of trees in Detroit-Ann Arbor area. Yes, the leaves are tumbling down right on cue as ye old Stage Manager in the sky slowly shakes the heavenly grid.

Such poetic thoughts are quite in keeping after witnessing a rip-roaring production of the APA's second play of the season, "The Hostage." Brendan Behan, an intoxicating Irish poet, wrote this play several years ago, but its freshness is still evident. Stephen Porter, the director, has infused even more life into the script by adding piquant bits of local color. "The Hostage" is a play that's fun for everyone: the audience, the actors, and the director.

Of course, if you are the type of theatergoer that might be a bit upset at a line that tugs the sleeve, you'd better say "no" to this artistic triumph. Mr. Behan pulled no punches. Mr. Porter in putting his actors through their Irish paces in this broth of a play played in a brothel has left no stone, holy or otherwise, unturned. "The Hostage" is a frenzied, whirlwind, side-splitting version of life itself. You might try to say your life is a bit more edgy. Such language does not emanate from your household. Well, let's be honest now, there are times when your life can truly represent all the wild, wonderful actions on the Lydia Mendelssohn stage.

The audience that Old Wally was a part of on opening night had little difficulty identifying the real-life situation presented so bizarrely. The gay, zestful atmosphere of Pat's liberal lodging house permeated every corner of the theater. Donald Moffat and Paddy Croft head up a cast that did its roles brilliantly. If there was a flaw anywhere, it was difficult to see it. The APA company danced, sang and generally bounced their way through a happy script. Clayton Corzette and Jennifer Harmon provided some tender moments, but it was the raucous, "no-holds-barred" times that gave the audience the greatest edge. Seldom does one find a play with so much criticism of our "mucked" up state of affairs as "The Hostage" does so amusingly. You will have ample opportunity to witness this marvellous play as it will be playing in repertory for the next six weeks over in Ann Arbor. Don't miss it—that is, if hairy situations and lines don't offend your delicate sense of hearing.
