

Livonia Boy Elected National Junior Achievement President

Michael Arthur, 18, of 14322 Garden Rd. in Livonia was recently elected National President of Junior Achievement at the annual J. A. Conference at Indiana University.

Arthur, a June graduate of Bentley High School, will be called upon to address business, civic and educational assemblies all across the United States. His expenses will be paid for by a sponsoring firm out of the Junior Achievement New York headquarters.

Mike won the award after a week of intensive campaigning that called on the experience and knowledge he gained through his two years of activities in Junior Achievement.

The written examinations questioned his understanding of economics, the free enterprise system, parliamentary procedure, and the Junior Achievement program.

After he had concluded the written tests in a exemplary manner, Mike was subjected to a series of interviews by groups of business and professional men. They tested his poise, manners, general attitude, and his ability to express himself under pressure.

Passing that stage, Arthur then addressed the National Association of Junior Achievers

in national competition was Thomas Kraus, 18, of St. Clair Shores.

Junior Achievement is an educational program for teenagers between the ages of 15 and 19 that is designed to teach an understanding of the American free enterprise system "by doing." The achievers are recruited through the high schools in the fall and enroll at one of the 16 J. A. business centers in the six-county Southeastern Michigan area.

After being divided into groups of 15 or 20, they are assigned a team of three volunteer advisers from business and industry. They then incorporate their group, elect officers, sell stock, and go into production of a product of their own choosing.

These miniature companies then continue to function and prosper until the end of the school year much the way their counterparts do in big business. In May the companies are voluntarily liquidated and the stockholders sent a report of company standing. In September the cycle is started all over again.

Mike's Junior Achievement company, of which he was president, was sponsored by Chevrolet Spring and Bumper and paid a 10% dividend last Spring.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Arthur, Mike is currently attending Schoolcraft Community College and is majoring in General Business.

Three other area teenagers also won awards. Dianne Meyer, 17, of St. Clair Shores is the National Secretary of Junior Achievement while Terrence Matejewski, 17, of Warren was selected the J. A. Safety Director of the Year. Chosen by the Young Presidents Organization (Y.P.O.) as the most outstanding president of a J. A. company
