La Parisien Theatre Opens With "Becket" Nov. 13

A new motion picture theatre is coming to this area.

The new and fabulous La Parisien will combine the serene beauty of French architecture with 20th century engineering marvels to produce the ultimate in motion picture enjoyment.

Located at Ford Road and Middle Belt, the theatre will hold its international premiere on Friday, Nov. 13. Doors will open at 5:45 p.m.

A semi circular service drive will beckon visitors as they approach the La Parisien, a theatre built at a cost of \$400,000. A paved lighted tree parking area for 700 cars is directly opposite the theatre.

A heated marquee will provide visitors with indoor warmth outside as they approach the box office to purchase tickets. There is also an indoor box office.

In keeping with La Parisien's policy of first rate screen entertainment, Hal Wallis' magnificent production, "Becket," starring Richard Burton and Peter O'Toole, direct from downtown triumph, will inaugurate the theatre's opening. "Becket" will remain indefinitely.

Entering the massive main doors, patrons will find themselves transported in time. The excellently chosen decor will evoke images of the grandest French courts, complete with regal draperies and furnishings.

A virtual aura of light will emit from imported crystal chandeliers, set tastefully in recessed plaster domes. All doors and hardware are in bronze finish. They will be enthralled by the lobby of marble, the specially designed luxury carpeting, which extends throughout the theatre, and the gold wallpaper with black flooring. Even the concession area has received the master's touch with antique mirrors set against a background of sparkling crystal wall scones. Several costly palms add grandeur to the lobby and lounge.

The Fireplace Lounge, immediately adjoining the lobby is recessed with two steps lead-

ing to its elegantly furnished interior including a custom made Marie Antoinette mantle. The lounge has three large floor to ceiling windows with amber glass set in diamond shaped frames.

The owners, the Shafter family are no strangers to the theatre business, for they also own and operate the State Theatre, Wayne as well as the Wayne and Algiers Drive-In. But they readily admit that the La Parisien is their greatest achievement.

The La Parisien is a different type of theatre. It surpasses anything ever done before, and its uniting of majesty and sheer architectural splendor forms the highest degree of movie going enjoyment.

Following "Becket," the La Parisien will feature the first Detroit showing of the new Ivan Fleming production, "Gold-



finger." The theatre will open Monday through Friday at 4:45 p.m. and at 12:45 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday.
