

'Hot' Issues Face All Area School Boards At State Meeting

Suburban school board members, in a state-wide convention in Grand Rapids this Thursday and Friday (November 5, 6) will tackle a number of significant resolutions which will be long debated in Lansing legislative halls.

Representing the Livonia system are Board Secretary Strela H. Schreiber and Joseph A. Milko, Chairman of the Building Construction and Maintenance Committee.

Besides two days of discussion of tax assessments and appraisals, community relations, school board policies and procedures, Federal legislation and other topics, the Michigan Association of School Board members will have an opportunity to see displays of new school construction, equipment and supplies.

At last week's meeting of the Livonia Board of Education the trustees reviewed resolutions and gave delegate Schreiber the go-ahead signal on a number of strong legislative issues.

Among the resolutions backed by the Livonia Board were:

DOLLARS FOR INTEREST

On October 1, 1964, school districts of Michigan had borrowed \$33,657,800.00 against anticipated state aid as well as other money on anticipated taxes for the 1964-65 fiscal year. Hundreds of thousands of dollars were obligated for payment of interest on this borrowing.

WHEREAS, interest money paid by Michigan school districts has been money used which could have been used for better education of boys and girls

BE IT RESOLVED, this association will work for legislative and administrative rules which will assure that moneys now used for interest payments may be used for educational purposes.

SPECIAL ELECTIONS

Due to primary and general state elections being held in the fall of 1964, many school districts in Michigan have found it impossible under existing election laws to call a Special Election between July 24 and December 14, other than on a day of the primary or general election.

WHEREAS, many school districts have also encountered difficulty in the past in scheduling elections because of the closing of registration books due to city or township elections as required by Act 207 of the Public Acts of 1961, and

WHEREAS, present law permits of the taking of registrations for city or township purposes while the registration records are closed for school election purposes, and

WHEREAS, many school districts maintain their own registration records and vote by paper ballots, thereby eliminating any impediments to the holding of its elections immediately following city or township elections, and

WHEREAS, it appears that present legislation is unduly restrictive and is potentially detrimental to the educational interests of the children of this state, and that corrective legislation is necessary to facilitate the calling of special elections

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Michigan Association of School Boards study the problems involving the calling of Special Elections in school districts and work for the enactment of such legislation as the Association deems necessary and desirable to facilitate the calling of such elections.

PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCING

The body of knowledge continues to increase. The number of pupils to educate increases. The needs of public elementary, middle, and secondary schools increase.

WHEREAS, school districts throughout the State of Michigan have, during the past several years, requested of the legislature that the state bear a greater share of the cost of public education, and

WHEREAS, state support as it relates to increasing enrollments and increasing costs have been diminishing, and

WHEREAS, local support which is dependent on property taxes as its only support has reached near confiscatory levels in some areas, and

WHEREAS, continuous improvement of public education in Michigan is a responsibility shared jointly by the legislature and local boards of education, and

WHEREAS, extensive studies have been made in recent years to seek a fair solution to the support of our public schools as it should be shared between the state and local districts, and

WHEREAS, such studies have identifiable factors which should be considered in the development of a sound program for a state and local partnership in the support of public school education

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that legislation for financing public schools shall be enacted which assures that public funds shall be allocated to schools, which allocation:

1. Is determined through uniform assessing practices.

2. Considers the available

wealth of the district.

3. Considers the overall tax load of the citizens and the extra millage voted by the district.

4. Analyzes the needs of its enrollment in geographical areas of the State, and

5. Recognizes quality of educational program.

Other resolutions will be discussed in Grand Rapids by board members representing Farmington, Redford Union, South Redford, Plymouth, Nankin Township and other suburban boards.

In addition to Mrs. Schreiber and Mr. Milko of Livonia, other suburban area delegates attending the annual convention will be: Mrs. Esther Rodding of Plymouth; Mrs. Anna Mary Vollick of Redford Union; Mrs. Jeanne Leonard of South Redford; Mrs. Barton Brown, Mr. Lee Clifford and Mr. Herbert Neil of Farmington; G. F. Malcone, Dr. Benjamin Jordan, David Goore and Frank Hanisch of Nankin Township; and others.

Most of the superintendents in Western Wayne County are also expected to attend.
