## Rev. Chambers Speaks At Rosedale Church

On Nov. 13, at 1:30, the United Church Women of Plymouth will gather for a worship service in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Epiphany, 41380 Five Mile Rd., to observe World Community Day.

Gifts of school supplies and wearing apparel for children in Brazil and the African nations will be dedicated. Participating churches are Assembly of God, Epiphany Lutheran, First Baptist, First Methodist, First Presbyterian, Latter Day Saints, Salvation Army, St. John's Episcopal, and Wesleyan Methodist. General chairman of the program is Mrs. John H. Schmidt, Epiphany Lutheran.

Mrs. Philip Gentile, Lehigh Village, will be the speaker for the service. Her rich experiences include participation in such groups as Citizens Advisory Committee on School Needs, Oakland County Community College Advisory Council, YWCA, Detroit Council of Churches, Women's International Education Council, YMCA Board of Directors, League of Women Voters, and American Association for University Women.

Besides being an educator and an active participant in community, county, and state affairs, Mrs. Gentile has served as official delegate to the United States Commission for UNESCO conferences; has observed UNO meetings in Italy, Switzerland and France; is in Who's Who of American Women; serves as president of United Church Women of Southfield; and holds the Distinguished Service Award of the U.S. Committee for the United Nations.

Mrs. Gentile comes to World Community Day observance as the role of an official United Nations observer, a position sponsored through a Ford Foundation grant.

The United Church Women is the movement of Protestant-Orthodox church women which makes it possible for them to do together what they can never do separately. Although these dedicated women are not united in creed or ritual, nor in church affiliation, they are united in strong faith in the cause to which they are giving their energies, believing in the oneness of God's people and His kindness.

Canon Bryan Green, of Birmingham, England, and his three co-missioners, will be conducting a series of Preaching Missions in the Diocese of Michigan from Nov. 1 through 22.

This team is in the Diocese at the invitation of the Rt. Rev. Richard S. Enns, Episcopal Bishop of Michigan.

Canon Green, who is known as "England's Greatest Preacher" was the speaker at the Festival of Faith Service held under the auspices of the Detroit Council of Churches in Cobo Hall on Nov. 1.

On Nov. 8 at 3 p.m. he will address a Detroit Metropolitan Youth Rally at the Masonic Temple in Detroit. Canon Green's topic will be "Love, Friendship, Marriage, Basis for Christian Sex Morality."

The week of Nov. 9 the Canon will preach at the High School Auditorium in Ypsilanti on the evening of 8 p.m. The Auditorium is located on West Cross Street, between Washington and Adams, in Ypsilanti.

Canon Green and the Rev. Harold Frankham will conduct Mission Services in Cobo Hall, 15 through 22, at 8 p.m.

Refreshments will be served following the workshop.

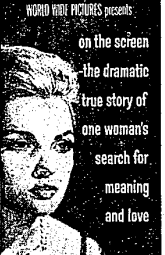
