Said bonds will be dated November 1, 1964, will be coupon bonds in the denomination of five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) each, will be numbered consecutively in direct order of maturity from one (1) to two hundred fifty (250), both inclusive, will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding four and one-half per cent (4½%) per annum, expressed in multiples of 1/20 of 1%. A certified or cashier's check in an amount of \$25,000.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer of the Community College District, must accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages If such bid be accepted and the bidder falls to take up and pay for the bonds, No interest shall be allowed on the good faith checks and checks of unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.
