3 of 4 Who Abut Bank Favor It

A resident of Kimberly Subdivision called the Observer last week, to present an affirmative view of the proposed National Bank of Detroit branch in that subdivision.

The man is Fletcher Armstrong, and his home about the three lots, at Middle Belt and 11 Mile Road, that have been selected as the Bank site.

In the course of conversation, he pointed out a pair of inaccuracies in the Observer's recent article on the re-zoning of these lots.

He noted that the Thompson-Brown Co. was not the owner of the lots but merely the sales organization empowered to sell them.

Contrary to our presentation, he explained, the Bank was not requesting that the lots be re-zoned "commercial." The classification they seek is "office." This, he said, is distinctly different. If the building were to be converted to a gas station, it would first have to be re-zoned "commercial."

At last week's Township Board Meeting, Donald Howard, who lives near the proposed bank site, gave the results of a recent informal poll he had taken. Thirteen of the 14 people he talked to were opposed to re-zoning.

Armstrong offered statistics that lent a different impression. Of the four families, including his, that about the proposed Bank site, three are in favor of having the Bank there.

Armstrong lauded the Bank's graciousness.

"The Bank has held seven meetings. My wife has gone to all of them, and I have gone to six.

"They agreed to put in a green belt. They moved the fence in five feet from my fence; to be further away from property. They are putting up a face-brick fence, five feet above present ground level. The building will be 16 feet high. Therefore — taking the excavation depth of five feet into consideration—the roof would be the only part of the bank that would be visible to us."

Township Supervisor Curt Hall has set a public meeting on this controversy, for Nov. 24. It is to be preceded by a meeting of the Kimberly Subdivision Association.
