

Hare Asks Law Requiring Legislators Disclose Holdings

LANSING—Secretary of State James M. Hare, who has proposed that top officials and members of the legislature disclose all their financial holdings, has urged that a law similar to that enacted in New York last year be used as a pattern for Michigan to follow.

"I think that a declaration of income and sources of income as well as holdings by Michigan officials might prevent a possible future major scandal from hitting Michigan as it has in other states on the national scene," Hare said.

The New York law makes it a misdemeanor for members of its legislature to accept gifts valued at more than \$25 if the purpose could be inferred as to influence legislation, Hare said.

"Lawmakers in New York are now required to disclose any stock interest in a business regulated by the state, rather than only interest exceeding \$10,000 as in previous New York law," Hare indicated. "Further they are required to list offices held in any corporation and disclose any other relationships that might reasonably be expected to be particularly affected by legislative action."

"If a legislator owns 10 percent of more of a company, New York law says the legislator is barred from providing the state with goods or services valued at \$25 or more unless the contracts are let by competitive bids," Hare said.

The New York statute also prohibits legislators from accepting on a contingent fee basis, cases before the Court of Claims and state agencies. The law lists "general standards" to help legislators to avoid compromise in a confusing and embarrassing situations which could be misinterpreted and blown out of proportion to further political advantage.

As guidelines, New York also provides for an advisory committee composed of a standing committee on ethics from each house of the state legislature and the dean of the Albany Law School and president of the New York State Bar Association.

Changes In Mass To Be Demonstrated

One of the decisions of the Ecumenical Council (Vatican II) which has a far-reaching effect is the granting of permission to use the vernacular in the administration of the sacraments of the Catholic Church.

Here in America the English language is already in full use in the forms for Baptism, Confirmation, and Extreme Unction. On Sunday, Nov. 29, it will be introduced into the low Masses throughout the country.

This change in public worship involves instructing both priests and laity, as there is to be also a greater participation and response on the part of the laity.
