Sex Problems Topic For Clergy

ANN ARBOR

"Sexual and Marital Problems," a two-day conference for clergy, will be held at the University of Michigan medical center July 31-Aug. 1.

W. Noel Brown, a member of the University Hospital chaplain staff and one of the conference planners, said it will focus primarily on ways in which clergy can respond to persons having difficulties expressing sexuality.

He added that numerous changes in society's mores and life styles over the past two decades have added new demands and pressures on both married and unmarried persons. Consequently, he said, clergy are faced with learning to understand their own sexuality and to discuss the expressions of sexuality by others openly and non-judgmentally.
