Bruegel's 'The Wedding Dance' Named Painting of the Month

Possibly the best-known work in the Detroit Art Institute's collection is "The Wedding Dance" by Pieter Bruegel the Elder—the Institute's Painting of the Month for January.

The 16th century Flemish masterpiece owes much of its popularity to lively patterns of bright color and the strong human interest of its subject.

More than 125 figures cavort in a peasant wedding celebration. From the heavy-footed dancers in the foreground to solitary figures at the edge of the crowd, all intrigue the ming and the eye.

Not a great deal is known about Bruegel himself, but his work reveals him as one of the finest and greatest masters of genre—the painting of ordinary people at work and at play.
