At the end of the first week of the current school year, the school district showed an increase over the closing figures of June, 1964. The following chart shows a more detailed pattern of pupil population:

Even with this set of figures, enrollment is conclusive due to the changes still being made by late enrollments. It is anticipated that some 100-150 more students will be enrolled by the end of September.

Madonna College Students To Tutor C'ville Pupils

Again this year the Clarenceville School District will have the aid of Madonna College senior girls. The girls, in the form of individual tutoring and groups of the junior and senior high schools, is given by the Madonna girls on a volunteer basis.

The program proved so helpful to students last year that many requests were made for a continuation of the tutoring. Mrs. Genvieve, principal of the high school, announced that the program would be continued this year.

About 100 Madonna Senior girls have already signed up for tutoring. The hours are from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. and each girl tutors one student for an hour. The student participation is also on a voluntary basis.

Students who are interested in receiving tutoring and parents who are interested in having their children tutored are asked to contact the student's counselor, giving student's name, grade, sex and problem area by October 1, no later than tomorrow, Friday, October 2.

All tutoring will be done at Clarenceville High School Monday through Thursday between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m.

There is absolutely no charge to the district, the schools or to the students in this tutoring program. It was emphasized.

Must Sign Up By October 2

All students who have not yet registered in the Clarenceville School District for the coming year for any reason are urged to register no later than tomorrow, Friday, October 2.

All State Aid to the District is based upon the number of pupils enrolled on or before the fourth Friday of the school year. Students who can be enrolled by October 2, but are not enrolled after that date will cause a loss of State Aid to the school district.

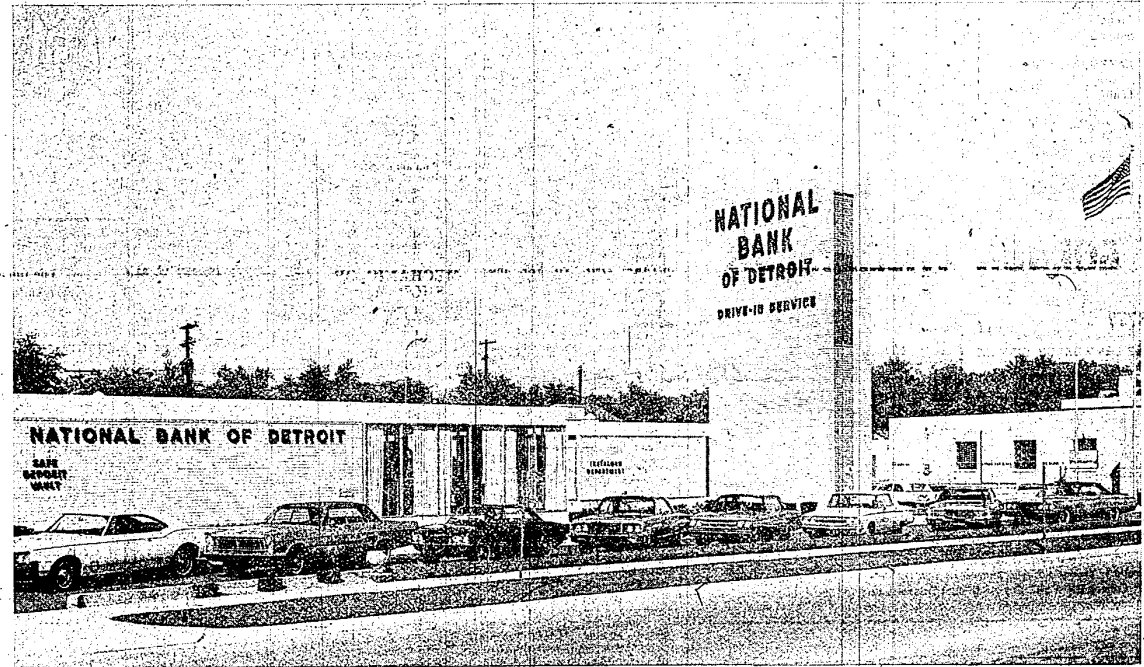
