Mr. Ettinger, a teacher at Highland Park College, will come to North Farmington just two days after a New York trip to see the appearance of the Les Crane Show, a late evening program to be nationally televised by ABC (Channel 7), beginning November 8.

This controversial book proposes the freezing and preservation of the newly dead with the hope that science of the future will be able to revive, restore, repair and rejuvenate the frozen to enjoy an indefinitely extended, glorious life. It has already been published in this country, Canada, and France; will soon be available in England, Germany, Italy, and Holland; and is being serialized in many publications in this country and around the world, even as far away as Australia and South Africa.

Mr. Ettinger has been expanding his revolutionary concept on television and radio with appearances from coast-to-coast. His book is now into its second printing, has stirred comment, questions, and activity.
