Local Democratic Candidates Thank Voters for Nov. 3 Support

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington was held on November 2, 1964.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Lindbergh at 8:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL: Councilmen Brotherton, Forrest, Peterson, Thayer present. Absent: None.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Dinan, Acting Clerk Buck, City Attorney Kelly, Chief of Police.

REX CRAWLEY DAY: November 14, 1964.

PROCLAMATION: REX CRAWLEY DAY.

WHEAREAS: Warren "Ray" Cawley, on October 16, 1964, won the 400 meter hurdles in near record time of 49.6 seconds at the Summer Olympic Games in Tokyo, and was champion in capturing a gold medal for the United States. Rex Cawley has added greater honor to his country through the world, and his achievements are a source of pride to the citizens of Farmington.

WHEREAS: Rex Cawley's dedication, desire to excel, and ability to win the highest of athletic awards will certainly inspire the youth of Farmington to strive for this achievement, and

WHEREAS: Rex Cawley has bestowed honor and recognition upon Farmington, Michigan, and All-American Track Star at Farmington High School in establishing state and national records that have not been exceeded, and

WHEREAS: the citizens of Farmington are very proud of the achievements attained by Rex Cawley, including establishment of a world record for 400 meter hurdles in 49.6 seconds and for his excellent performance in winning this event at the 1964 Summer Olympics in Tokyo.

NOW, THEREFORE: We, Robert B. Lindbergh, Mayor of the City of Farmington, and Curtis H. Hall, Supervisor of the Township of Farmington, do hereby proclaim November 14, 1964 as

REX CRAWLEY DAY

and urge all our citizens to join in paying tribute and honor to Farmington's own Olympic champion.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that a copy of this Proclamation be presented to Rex Cawley on behalf of the citizens of Farmington.

WITNESS WHEREOF: we have hereunto set our hands and caused the seals of the City of Farmington and Township of Farmington to be affixed.

Mayor Lindbergh urged that the people of the City of Farmington pay tribute to Rex Cawley for his wonderful example of achievements and excellent performance in winning the 400 meter hurdles in the 1964 Summer Olympics in Tokyo.

City Manager Dinan stated that letters had been received from the utility companies approving vacation of north six feet of the twelve foot easement on Lot 280, Bel-Aire Hills Subdivision. He stated that there was no objection by the utility companies for proposed vacation of north six feet of twelve foot easement south of and adjacent to Lots 253-283 inclusive, Bel-Aire Hills. He stated that it would be necessary to establish a separate public hearing for the vacation of six foot easement on remaining lots.

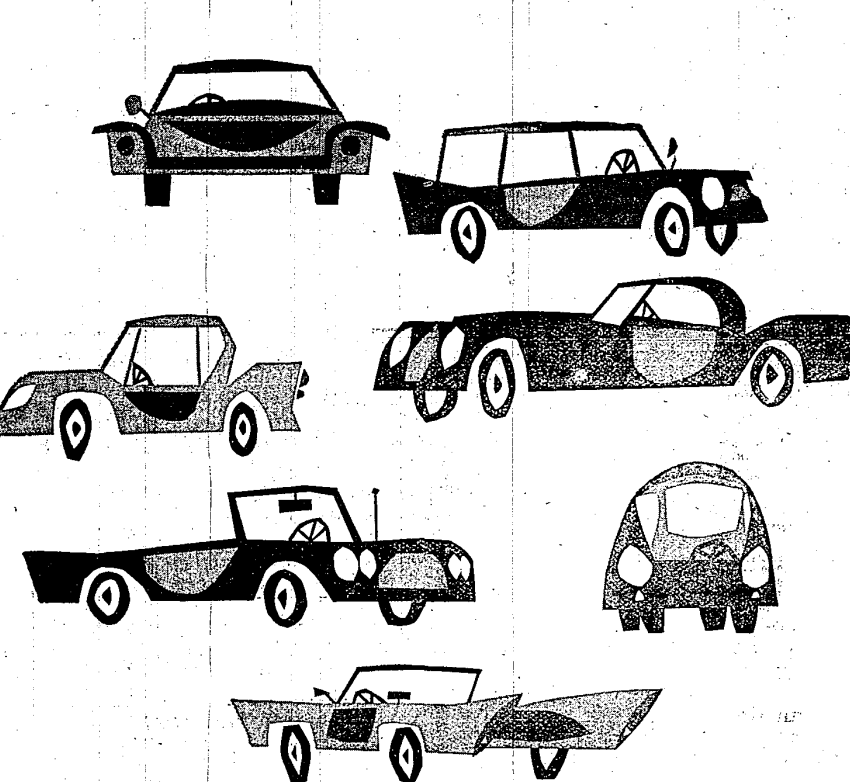
