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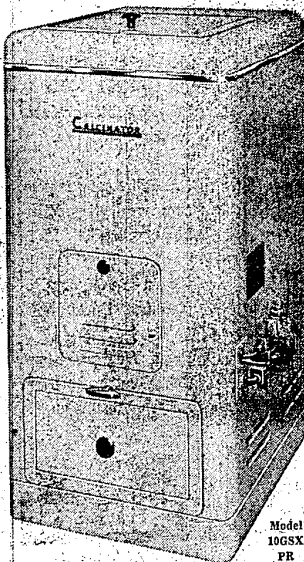
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WMU Seniors Plan Student Teaching Work

More than 500 Western Michigan University seniors are preparing to become teachers by taking part in the student teaching program in classrooms throughout Southwestern Michigan.

Marking one of the final steps in pre-teaching training, the students spend one semester of their senior year in their subject fields working with experienced teachers. According to Dr. A. L. Sebaly, director of student teaching and professor of education at WMU, the on-the-job type of training helps the seniors decide what phase of teaching they are most interested in before they actually sign a contract. It also lets them apply educational theories to practical classroom situations.

Of the group now doing their student teaching, 205 are planning to become elementary teachers, 187 to be elementary teachers and 25 planning to work in Special Education.

FARMINGTON AREA student teachers include: William Dangness, a 1957 graduate of Farmington High, now living in North Valley Apartments on the WMU campus, teaches General Shop at Kalamazoo Hillsdale Junior High. The twenty-four-year-old senior is majoring in Industrial Arts. He is married and he has attended the University of Wyoming.

Madelyn Weir, the daughter of Mr. Orville H. Weir, 26574 Greyhorne Trail, teaches the first grade at Kalamazoo Lincoln Elementary School. A 1961 graduate of Trenton High, she is majoring in Social Science.

Oakland Mental Health Board Active in Plans, Survey Work

If your spouse faces a nervous breakdown, and you cannot afford private care, where can you take him? Your father has been released from a mental hospital and is having difficulty readjusting to living in the community. Where can he get help?

The answers to these questions and others pertaining to mental health in Oakland County are being sought by the Oakland County Community Mental Health Services Board. Gerald V. Harrison, 32500 Shawnee, Farmington, superintendent of Farmington Schools, serves as chairman of the administration and staffing committee of the Board.

The Board's Plan Committee is devising into the services now offered for mentally ill and retarded in the County. A questionnaire has been sent to public and private health and welfare agencies in the county in order to determine what mental care facilities are available.

Results of the survey and recommendations will be presented to the Board in December. The 12-man Board, formed nearly one year ago under Public Act 51, will coordinate, strengthen and broaden mental health services in the county. Patients will pay for the services according to their financial ability.

The Board received approval from the county for \$250,000 toward its budget for 1955. Presently members seek from the state a matching sum, as designated by the Community Mental Health Services Act.

The Act resulted from a nationwide recommendation of professional psychiatrists to emphasize treatment in the community of mentally ill, rather than mere custodial care in crowded state hospitals. Oakland County was one of the first to organize, with an interim consultant psychiatrist, and to prepare a budget for future operation. Paul N. Averill, of Birmingham, is Board chairman. Offices are at the Service Center in Pontiac.

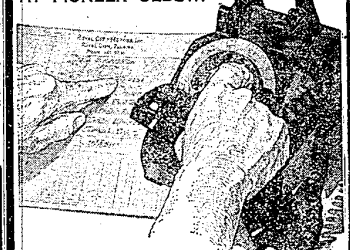
Baseball for Boys Award Nite Nov. 10

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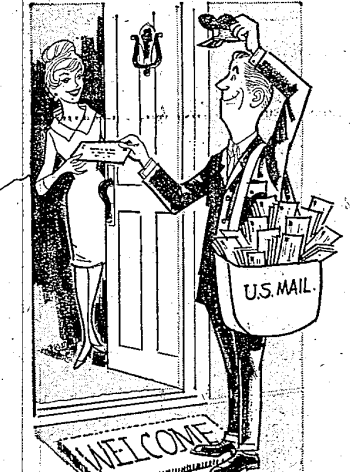
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
