Marilyn Grey won first prize, Arlene Strane won second and Janet Streng took Booby when their Bridge Club met at Nan Held's, last Wednesday.

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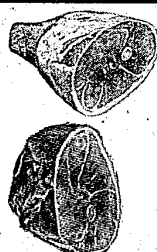
