Thanksgiving Services Set At Science Ch.

Thanksgiving Day services will be held in First Church of Christ Scientist, Farmington at 11 o'clock. Visitors are welcome. One feature of the service will be a period when individual Christians will stand up voluntarily to express their thanks to God in their own words. The sermon on "Thanksgiving" - as in all Christian Science services - will consist of readings from the Bible, and also from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy. There will also be hymns and a period of prayer. "THE GOLDEN TEXT for the day is from Psalms 22: "All the ends of the world shall remember and turn unto the Lord; and all the kindreds of the nations shall worship before thee."

A related passage to be read from Science and Health includes these lines: "It should be thoroughly understood that all men have one Mind, one God and Father, one Life, Truth, and Love. Man's mind will become perfect in proportion as this fact becomes apparent; man will cease and the true brotherhood of man will be established" (p. 467-9-13).

Biblical Scholar to Speak At Unity of West Suburbia

This Sunday, November 22, Dr. George Lamasa, one of the great Bible authorities of this age, will be the guest speaker at Unity of West Suburbia. Dr. Lamasa is an admirer of the ancient world of Jesus Christ and the modern world of the 20th century man. Born in Kurdistan, Iran (Persia), his early years patterned the customs and way of life similar to those of the people 2000 years ago. His language, Aramaic, has remained virtually unchanged throughout the centuries and is the same that Jesus spoke. His family life in Lamasa's section of the world was based on the Peschitta, which is the pure, unadorned, complete teachings of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, written in Aramaic, the tongue in which they were first spoken.

UPON HIS ARRIVAL in the United States in 1917, Dr. Lamasa found many contradictions between the Aramaic texts he knew and those of the revised editions of the Holy Scriptures. These discrepancies, along with an irresistible inner urging, prompted him to begin a translation of the Bible from its original Aramaic source. This undertaking took him 25 years. Today, he is regarded by all Christian faiths as one of the most outstanding Biblical scholars of the religious world. He has also authored many books and become a sought after world famous lecturer.

FOR THIS SPECIAL occasion, the minister of Unity of West Suburbia, Mrs. Diane Seaman, has planned two services so as to accommodate the greatest number of visitors. The first service will be held at 9:15 a.m. and the second, at 11:00 a.m. Those who have children enrolled in the Sunday School are urged to come to the first service, so that the children may attend their regular class. However, there will be a Junior Church for the children at the 11 a.m. service.

Unity is located at 30025 Curtis Road, just west of Middlebrook Road, (Curtis is equivalent to 6 1/2 Mile Road). The Center is open Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. for prayer counseling. Other regular activities include: a Wednesday evening lecture home with him.
