(Continued from Page 1-A) Township with homes in this price range, was started ten years ago and is still only about half completed.

TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY Joseph T. Brennan stated that an existing regulation on "site plan approval" can be used by the Township Zoning Board to restrict any buildings in a multiple zone area. Site plan approval is necessary before a building permit can be obtained for the construction of any building, but also the zoning board, pointed out, land zoned for multiple use does not preclude controlling action by the Zoning Board prior to the actual construction of a proposed multiple development.

Another legal point brought up at the Monday night meeting was to what use the golf course would be put to immediately and what future requirements, as the development is expanded with the addition of more apartment house units, would have to be complied with to change the initial operation of the golf course.

D. UNANSWERED by the question by stating the ultimate intention is to have the golf course function solely as a private club, such as the Brookdale Club in Farmington. Residents in the Village Green development will have priority in membership in the golf club which will open initially as a semi-private operation. As more apartment house units are added to the development, the heavy tax load carried by homeowners of the community today.

Some of the questions which were put to Duke by Board members and those present to speak on the proposed development largely centered on the need for more "multiple housing" and what would happen should the trend in housing change during the several years the project is under construction.

The panel of judges would consist of the chiefs of police from both the City and Township, two clergymen and the Probate Judge of Juvenile Division.

JUDGING WOULD be based on grammatical correctness and ability in using the English language and other scholastic considerations.

The essays would also be judged on the basis of originality, wisdom of thought, the problem and constructiveness of suggestions made.

OPPERTHAUSER outlined the principal purposes he hoped could be achieved by establishing such an essay contest. The six purposes are:

1. To focus the attention of Farmington youth on the seriousness of the problem of vandalism;
2. To encourage self-education and the moral revitalization of our youth;
3. To mold teenage public opinion as a driving force against vandalism;
4. To prevent the senseless destruction of property and teach respect for the rights of others;
5. To gain insight and understanding of the causes of juvenile vandalism;
6. To obtain practical and new suggestions from our youth for a fresh assault on the problem.

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
