Detroit Bank & Trust will officially open its new main office in Detroit at 9 a.m., Saturday, December 12.

The new multi-million dollar banking center was formally dedicated Sunday, December 6, in ceremonies attended by Governor George Romney and Mayor Jerome P. Cavanagh as well as business, cultural and educational leaders.

Detroit Bank & Trust is the nation's 24th largest bank with assets of more than \$1.2 billion.

The new main office is located on the first seven floors and two lower levels of the 26-story Detroit Bank & Trust Building at Fort Street and Washington Boulevard in the heart of the city's business and financial district. It also includes the first floors of the adjacent Fort and Shelby Streets which houses the bank's trust department. Completely remodeled at a cost of approximately \$2 million, the Fort-Shelby wing of the new main office is connected with the Detroit Bank & Trust Building by a three-story, glass-enclosed link.

The massive new banking lobby occupies almost the entire first floor of the Fort-Shelby wing.

With the opening of the new headquarters for its 68-office system, Detroit Bank & Trust has consolidated almost all of its central operations which, in recent years, have been scattered in several downtown locations. More than 100 people are employed in the new main office.

The bank's former main office at State and Griswold Streets will remain a major downtown banking center, serving the nearby retail district.

In addition, a few major de-

real estate—will remain there as a convenience to customers who work in or visit the retail area.
