



Capt. Buck Awarded Air Medal For Record - Breaking Flight

Capt. John T. Buck of Farmington has been awarded the US Air Force Air Medal for his part in a Tactical Air Command, long distance deployment, non-stop flight from Florida to Turkey, this year. Capt. Buck, currently attending Air University's Air Command and Staff College at Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomery, Alabama, was in command of one of 18 F-100 jet fighter aircraft which left Homestead Air Force Base, Fla. for a 6,600-mile, 22-hour flight, non-stop to Cigli Air Base in Turkey in February of 1964. Eight aerial re-fuelings were required during the flight. Six of them were performed in dense cloud conditions. THE FLIGHT, a Tactical Air Command, long distance deployment operation, was designed to display the global capabilities of the F-100 aircraft. The longest non-stop flight made to date in an F-100 aircraft, the US to Turkey deployment was made by pilots of the crack 309th Tactical Fighter Squadron, stationed at Homestead AFB, Fla.

Capt. Buck was awarded the Air Medal for his part in a flight of F-100 aircraft, US Tactical Air Command jet fighters, from Homestead Air Force Base in Florida in Cigli Air Base in Turkey, which established a new long distance record for the U.S. Air Force. The 6,600-mile non-stop flight took 22 1/2 hours.


The squadron followed the northern route, flying over water, picking up 26-foot waves brought on by 60-knot winds. "The hazardous weather is what made the outcome of the flight so important," said Captain Buck. "We proved TAC's capability in spite of the elements."
 CAPT. BUCK also recently received a Commendation Medal from Tactical Air Command for his action which saved a plane during a TAC squadron deployment to Okinawa in the South Pacific. One of the main landing gears on Capt. Buck's F-100 would not go down as he approached the Okinawa airstrip. In stead of bailing out, Capt. Buck landed the plane with the faulty landing gear, saving the taxpayers considerable expense. The plane is now back on operational status after undergoing repairs. Capt. Buck was not injured.
 Capt. Buck is the son of Mrs. Eutie Buck and the late Howard Buck Macomb Avenue in Farmington. He is a graduate of Farmington High School and the University of Michigan. He is married to the former Nancy Louise Isley, daughter of Mrs. Mary Isley and the late George G. Isley of Oakland Avenue in Farmington. They have four children.
