Special Elections Not the Real Answer

In the near future Farmington Township voters will be asked to go to the polls for a special election on the pay increases that were authorized by the four trustees on the seven member Farmington Township Board for the township's three top elected officials. Petitions were circulated and a sufficient number of signatures obtained on them by law to make a referendum vote on the pay increases granted the supervisor, clerk and treasurer mandatory. It is the right of citizens by law to demand such an election if a sufficient number petition for it and we think a date should be set and this election held as quickly as possible.

It has now been learned that another petition is being circulated calling for a second special election on the recent action taken by our township officials approving re-zoning to permit multiple housing units in a large village green type of development north of Grand River Ave. near Drake Road.

The Enterprise doesn't question the legal right of citizens to petition for as

this manner will thus detract from the amount of time and energies that can be put forth in taking care of other important matters that come up that are many and varied in mature and growing community.
