

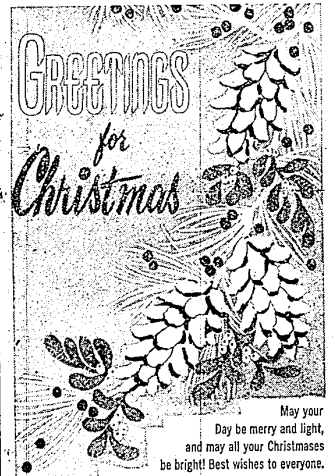
Midnight Christmas Service Set At S'field Community Church

A total of 1,524 candidates were awarded degrees at Wayne State University's winter commencement exercises Tuesday, Dec. 15, at Cobo Hall. Dr. Clarence B. Hilberry, president of WSU, conferred 550 bachelors' degrees, 518 masters' degrees, 40 Ph.D. degrees and 15 Ed.D. degrees. The breakdown by colleges and schools is: College of Education, 268 bachelors and 201 masters; College of Liberal Arts, 219 bachelors and 112 masters; School of Business Administration, 104 bachelors and 43 masters; College of Engineering, 32 bachelors and 30 masters; Law School, 40 bachelors and one master; College of Nursing, 33 bachelors and 21 masters; College of Pharmacy, six bachelors and one master; School of Medicine, four bachelors and 11 masters; and Montclair College, 75 bachelors.

Air Force to Give Aptitude Tests to Seniors

T-Sgt. Edward Smith, U.S. Air Force Recruiter for the Farmington area, is pleased to announce that with the approval of the principals and counselors of Farmington's high schools, all seniors graduating in June 1958 will be permitted to take the Airman Qualifying Examination if so desired. The examination consists of tests in 4 areas: Mechanical, Administrative, General, and Electronics. The Mechanical Aptitude is based primarily on experience and knowledge of simple mechanical principals. The Administrative Index represents performance on tests measuring speeded response to quantitative materials, as well as knowledge of the meaning of words. The General Aptitude Index covers abilities in order to classify men and women in fields which depend on balanced ability rather than high specialization. The Electronic Aptitude Index is a measure of technical of the 4 in content, and is actually a measure of engineering aptitude.

Testing time is approximately 2 hours for all tests, and will be conducted at North Farmington High School on January 20, at 3:30 p.m. Seniors interested in taking the test are urged to contact their counselor, Mr. Barrows at Farmington, or Mr. Chadwick at Our Lady of Sorrows.

The tests are given regularly to determine the combat readiness of each soldier and his unit.

The 23-year-old soldier, a clerk in Battery B, First Battalion of the division's Third Artillery, entered the Army in November, 1953.

He is a 1939 graduate of Farmington High School and attended the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

The Second Armored Division, "Hell on Wheels," played a vital role in the Allied victory in the Battle of the Bulge during World War II.
