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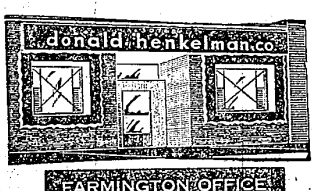

In a tournament in which four teams were unable to secure a single point, the Farmington crew came home with 20 points, a score which brought them a seventh place finish in the 16-team field.

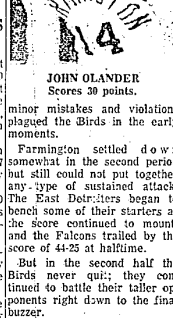

Arrow Hockey Team Has Stars

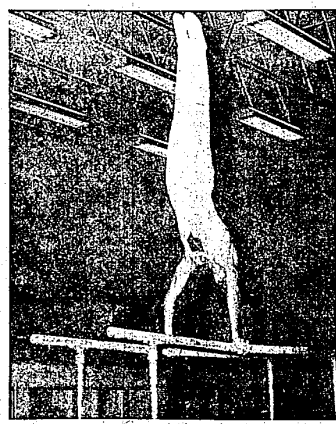

Gray, hope to be able to present the Sign of the Arrow to all 24 girls by next spring.

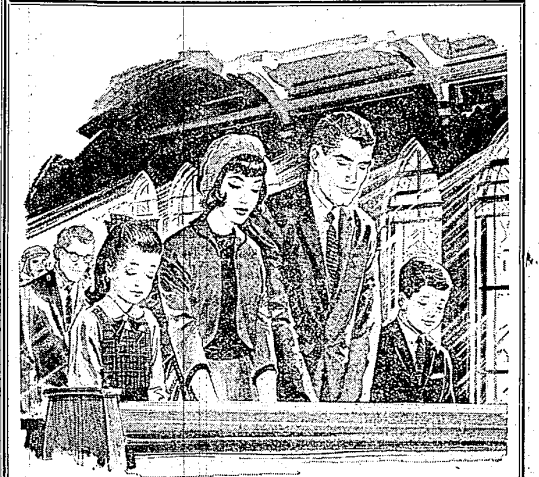
