"Taming of the Shrew," as presented by Wayne State University's Hilberry Classic Theatre, deserves a place in the theatre's successful presentation of one of Shakespeare's finest comedies. The Hilberry Theatre has an excellent stage, and perfect acoustics. The cast uses these advantages to the utmost and, coupled with their own performing talent, produce an outstanding play.

City Police Operations in '64

were charged. The City obtained convictions on a total of 224 of those arrested. 155 of those arrested were fined and 69 were charged and another 4 pleaded guilty or were found guilty on lesser charges.

The operations report for 1964 showed only a slight increase in traffic violations charged by police. Only 23 of the 1963 arrests were found guilty as charged and 12 were found guilty of lesser charges. Police arrests last year for the City totaled 438 compared to 17 for 1963. Misdemeanor arrests were 170 last year compared to 52 in 1963.

City Planners Review Jan. 11 Public Hearing

The Farmington City Planning Commission met Monday night, January 26, with City Manager John Dign and the City's firm of planning consultants to discuss the proposed zoning ordinance and map and consider possible revisions in the light of the views expressed by citizens at the public hearing on the proposed ordinance and map held January 11.

MONDAY NIGHT'S MEETING

centered mainly on the objections raised by citizens to proposed zoning changes. Maintained 142, up slightly from 135 reported last year. Total 23, all but 5 were closed.

several other proposed zoning measures with a view towards possible revisions that could be made to satisfy objections from affected property owners.

Poke Taken at Dem. Statement

Township Supervisor Curt Hall took a stiff jab at Monday night's regular Township Board meeting at a statement made in a story last week by Democratic City Chairman Aldo Vagozzi regarding citizens being permitted to speak at Board meetings.

The statement, listed as one

of the Democratic City's recent accomplishments, was "winning of a long-overdue system whereby citizens can be heard at township meetings on items that come up before the township board."

The supervisor's rebuttal

was that citizens have always been given an opportunity to be heard in the past and will be in the future when they follow the prescribed methods of procedure for speaking up in order to conduct an orderly meeting.

Those wishing to speak on

a specific matter may either sign their name on a special piece of paper prior to the start of the meeting stating what item on the agenda they wish to be heard on or express their desire to be heard at the point where approval of an official agenda is given. Hall said.

They can also speak during

the question and answer period at the end of the meeting as in the past, he added. "Our procedure on this matter remains the same," the supervisor said, in labeling the statement made in the paper by Vagozzi as totally false.
