Open Saturday For Taxpayers

As a special service to Farmington Township taxpayers who have found it impossible to get in to pay their taxes during regular township office hours, Monday through Friday, Treasurer Elise Avery has announced that her office will be open this Saturday, Feb. 6. The special Saturday hours, for the purpose of collecting taxes only, will be from 8:30 a.m. until 4 p.m. this Saturday. Again on Saturday, Feb. 27, Mrs. Avery's office will maintain these same Saturday hours. This will be the last opportunity taxpayers will have to pay their winter tax bills local.

The major purpose for the publication of the material is to educate citizens on the governmental functions with emphasis being placed on the programs undertaken by the community and the services performed by the city and township governments, it was stated.

"All material has been carefully researched and checked for accuracy," a spokesman for the League of Women Voters commented.

The booklet is expected to be ready for distribution to the general public at a nominal price the latter part of March. A big kick-off sales drive is scheduled at shopping centers and other key locations in the community on April 5, the date of the general election, the League spokesman concluded.

one mill tax over a ten year period as initially proposed.

Members of the Library Board did not feel this would permit the expansion they propose fast enough and therefore asked the Farmington Township Board to place their original one mill for 10 years tax request to township voters on the April 5 ballot. The Township Board unanimously approved this request at its regular meeting last Monday night.

IF TOWNSHIP voters approve the one mill special library expansion tax proposal on the April 5 ballot, city officials will be faced with the problem of either coming up with a proportionate amount based on equalized valuation or dissolution of the district library system will be necessary.

Regret was expressed by city officials that more detailed study had not been made with regard to how money might have been obtained to get work started immediately on the expansion planned and still have been able to require a smaller levy over a longer period of time.

The creation of a building authority to construct new library facilities and lease them back to the city and Township was one suggested method of permitting long term financing.

It was also pointed out that should township voters approve the special one mill levy for library expansion, the city would still be in a position to submit a proposal to city voters for the sale of bonds to finance its share of the cost for the planned expansion over a 20 year period. It was emphasized, however, that bonds would require a three-fifths "yes" vote.

City Manager John Dinan stated that dissolution of the library district would be very undesirable for the city. He estimated that it would cost the city more than \$50,000 per year to maintain a separate library system of its own compared to the \$14,000 presently being spent for library facilities and services.
