Action was taken after assurances were given that the plan for development had been reviewed and had their recommendation for approval. In separate action, the board also approved a preliminary plat plan for the 54 lot Franklin Ravine Subdivision proposed on a 30 acre parcel fronting on Middlebelt Road adjacent to the Ten Mile elementary school property. Another 20 acres further north and abutting the East Junior High property is not proposed for development at this time. During discussion prior to the official action, it was pointed out that the developers would be required to provide a sidewalk along Middlebelt Road to provide a safe route for children to and from school.
