**Fair Housing Campaign Here Set Feb. 21-28**

A campaign for signatures on a housing covenant card will be conducted during Brotherhood Week by the Farmington Housing Relations Council.

The cards, which include a statement against discrimination in housing, will be available from Council members and cooperating churches.

**BROTHERHOOD WEEK** is February 21-28.

"The covenant cards" give those who favor equality in housing an opportunity to band together around a simple statement of belief," said John Millhorne, council chairman.

"They have been used elsewhere to show a desire to accept changes in housing patterns peacefully and with good will."

MORE THAN 2,000 people have signed covenant cards in metropolitan Detroit. A recent campaign in the Grosse Pointes obtained more than 400 signatures.

The cards, obtained from the Greater Detroit Committee for Fair Housing Practices, state: "I believe that every person has the moral and legal right to rent, buy, or build a home anywhere without restrictions based on race, religion, or national origin."

"I BELIEVE IT is imperative for our metropolitan Detroit area that all persons of good will unite with others of like conviction to take an active role in helping to achieve this freedom of opportunity in housing."

Therefore, I will welcome into my neighborhood any responsible person of whatever race, religion, or national origin, and I will work with him to rent, buy, or build a home in a community which is good for all."

**THE CARDS CONTAIN** the provision that the names of the signers, but not their addresses, may be published together with not less than 2,000 other names.

A decision to conduct the covenant campaign was made Wednesday at a meeting of the Council's board of trustees.

A 150-member Council, formed nearly 15 years ago, is a non-profit, non-political organization that meets regularly in Farmington churches. The next meeting is at 8 p.m. March 22 at the Antioch Lutheran Church, 3360 West Thirteen Mile Road.

**We Are Wrong In Vietnam, Minister Says**

"We are wrong in Vietnam" is the subject of minister Robert M. Eddy's talk at the 10 a.m. service Sunday, Feb. 21, at the Universalist-Unitarian Church of Farmington.

Mr. Eddy said he would examine the present Vietnamese situation in the light of Communist China's aspirations, and explain why he believes that "we are doing just what China wants us to do."
