

Science - Health Workshop Held By Sixth Graders at Middlebelt

Sixth graders at Farmington's Middlebelt School did more than just cut red paper hearts in celebration of Valentine's day! In fact, these students have been cutting on real hearts during the past week.

This activity along with many others was part of a two-week science-health workshop on the heart and circulatory system. The boys and girls in this class, taught by Donald Scholz, used several sources in their attempt to find out what "makes them tick."

THE CLASS BEGAN their study of the heart by using films, models and charts provided by the Michigan Heart Association and the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare. To reinforce ideas presented in the films, each pupil had several notebook-size charts and printed materials. These were also provided by the Michigan Heart Association. Last Friday the class saw the movie "Hemo the Magnificent," loaned by

A third learning station had the respiratory system of a pig on display. After discussion and examination of this, the pupils were shown how the lungs work. This was done by using the pig's lung, into which air was pumped through a glass tube. In order for the boys and girls to get an idea of their own lung capacity, they blew into spirometers. Many scored above 3,000 cubic centimeters.

ANOTHER WORKSHOP activity gave the children an opportunity to use the stethoscope to listen to their own heartbeats and that of other classmates. They also used the "pressure cuff" to take each other's blood pressure.

The fifth learning activity included a discussion of blood types and a demonstration of how blood typing is done. Both teacher and students volunteered blood to be typed.

With such a variety of learning activities each student found at least one area in which he was especially excited and could successfully participate.


