The Farmington High Falconaires are one of several scheduled groups to perform in the "Festival of Music" March 27 at North Farmington High School. The program, being presented by the Kiwanis Club of Kendallwood, is the first planned annual program of its kind.

The Falconaires, a mixed vocal ensemble of 18 members, was organized some fifteen years ago. At that time the group was under the direction of Warren Henderson. The Falconaires served then as they do now, singing for community groups and at concerts. They have participated in district music festivals for several years where, almost without exception, they have received superior ratings.

In 1958, at the invitation of Kiwanis International and through the support of the Kiwanis Club of Farmington, many other service clubs, and the citizens of Farmington, the group traveled to Dallas, Texas where it entertained at the Kiwanis International Convention before some 15,000 people. 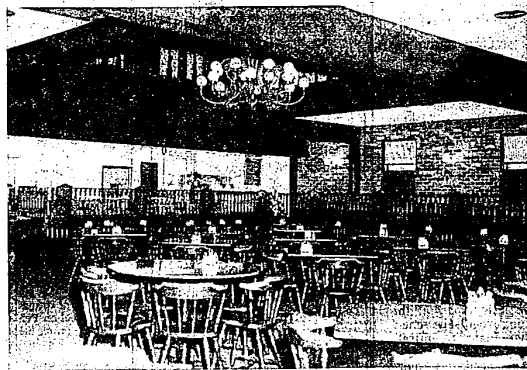
