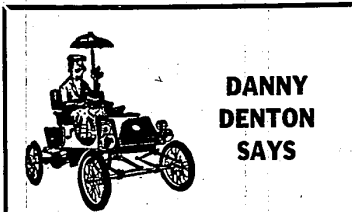

Dems Propose Fair Election Practices Comm.

The Farmington Democratic Club has proposed the creation of a local level Fair Election Practices Committee patterned after a similar unit now functioning at the state level.

The proposal for a Farmington FEPC was made in a resolution adopted at last week's Farmington Democratic Club meeting.

Democratic Club Chairman Aldo Vagnozzi said he proposed such a step now so that such a committee could be activated before next year's election campaign.

VAGNOZZI SAID his move was prompted by the persons of literature issued in recent campaigns which went beyond the scope of fair comment.

He cited a last-minute letter which tried to win support for the township officials salary increase in the Feb. 15 election, persons who attacked the late Paul Chandler and a letter by the Farmington Township attorney aimed at defeating a Justice of the Peace as examples of the type of literature which could be referred to in such a committee.

In each case the persons responsible for such literature misjudged the intelligence of the voters who promptly rejected their appeals. "Despite this rejection, the Peace is an impartial group to police election appeals of both parties and of individuals to prevent the use of personal attacks, unrelated to campaign issues," Vagnozzi said.

Vagnozzi said the Democratic Club is prepared to meet at any time with Republican leaders to work out formation of such a committee. The meeting spent considerable time discussing the almost impassable condition of Township roads and the defeat of the library proposal.

VAGNOZZI SAID he was not satisfied with the official explanation that the roads are in such bad shape because of nature and growing pains.

"The Spring and the thaw of the roads comes along at about the same time each year and yet our officials would have you believe that it's a big surprise when this predictable occurrence takes place," Vagnozzi said.

"At the same time, there is a reason why our officials can't insist that areas where sewer and water lines are being put in be restored to the same condition upon completion of the work as existed before such work was started," Vagnozzi also called on the officials to allot some of the road money to keeping the dirt roads in a passable condition.
