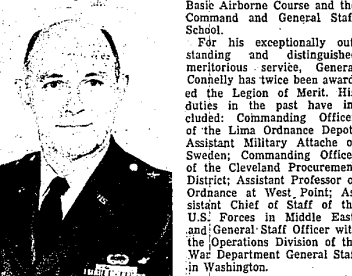

It was pointed out that the "new math" gives the pupils a better understanding of the how and why of mathematical processes.

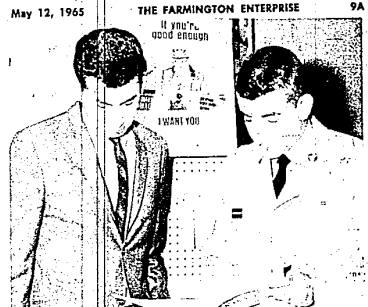

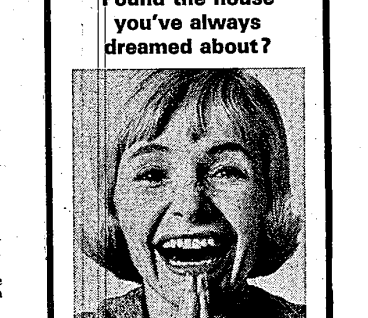

General Chairman Mrs. C. J. Tzofas announced the guest speaker would be Lawrence M. Carino, general manager of WJBK-TV.

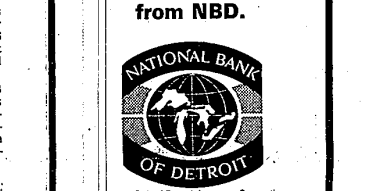
