

Mrs Becker to Judge At Local Art Exhibit

Mrs. Marjorie Becker, art coordinator in the Livonia Public Schools, will serve as judge for the Seventh Annual Art Exhibit of Farmington, opening July 11 at the Universalist-Unitarian Church.

A resident of Northville and one of the area's noted artists, Mrs. Becker, will judge for prizes from among entries submitted by scores of artists from the metropolitan area.

The exhibit will include paintings, drawings, graphics, sculpture, jewelry and ceramics.

It will get under way with a special program at the church, set for 12 noon on Sunday and will be open to the public from 1 to 3 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m. Monday through Saturday, July 12 to 17.

Each artist will be limited to two entries, and there will be a 75-cent entry charge for each. Prize money will be awarded from this fund.

EDUCATED at Eastern Michigan University, the University of Michigan and Wayne State University, Mrs. Becker has been chairman of the committee on Art in Education for the Metropolitan Detroit Bureau of School Studies, has worked with the Michigan Art Education Association committees and is past president of the Three Cities Art Club.

She has exhibited paintings with the Three Cities Art Club, the Invitational State Fair Exhibit, the Michigan Women

Painters and the Birmingham and Farmington art shows.

Several years ago her painting of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra was awarded purchase prize in a Plymouth show and was hung in the Dunning-Hough Plymouth Library.

In charge of the Farmington exhibit are Mrs. Wanda Pusey, Farmington artist, and Stanley Hench, Livonia public schools art consultant.

Entries may be submitted at the church Wednesday and Thursday, July 7 and 8, from 7 to 9 p.m. Exhibitors wishing further information may call Mrs. Pusey at GR. 4-5082.

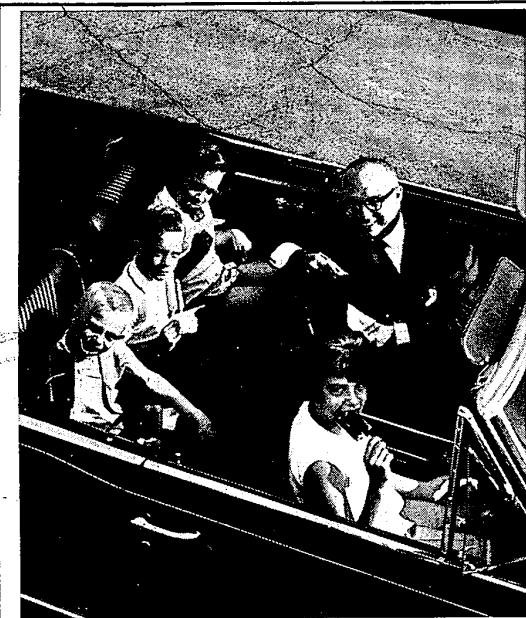
