## Farmington Coed Joins Summer Service Corps

Miss JoAnn Eshelman of 33870 Quaker Valley Road in Farmington, was among more than 800 college students and young adults who volunteered for a summer service corps to work under the auspices of the Board of National Missions, United Presbyterian Church, U.S.A. this year.

MISS Eshelman traveled to Minneapolis-St. Paul Sunday, June 13, for work there on the Inner City program of the Board of National Missions.

She will be a member of a four-person team which will be working with girls' club groups for first and second graders. She will also teach in vacation church schools, work with teen-age recreation groups, and do some visitation of children and homes in the downtown Minneapolis area. Room, board and any expenses on the field are paid for by the Presbyterian-Synod of Minnesota.

MISS Eshelman is in Minneapolis in hopes of becoming more understanding of the problems the city and the people in the downtown area face. In fact, she wants to bring something to the project which can help to alleviate the problems.

Most of them will work in poverty stricken communities in major cities of the nation and in such well publicized poverty areas as the Southern Appalachian migrant camps, Indian reservations and the rural South.

In addition, about 5,000 senior high school students and their advisers will also pay their own travel and living expenses to serve on short-term work camp teams assigned to similar areas of the country. Some 125 adults will take on specialized jobs... from teaching remedial reading to filling in while missionary medical staffs take well earned vacations.

THERE HAS BEEN A 400 per cent increase in the number of college students signing up for voluntary work under the Board of National Missions in the past five years, notes Rev. William H. Miller of New York, director of the Department of Voluntary Service and Youth Ministry. The increase for senior highs has been 100 per cent within the past four years.

A growing number of newly retired men and women are also giving their time and professional skills to the church's missionary work, he says.

MORE THAN HALF of the college-age volunteers will

work in churches and other projects in low-income inner-city urban communities. In Kansas City, for instance, they will help churches with their Christian education programs and in voter registration efforts. In New York City, Chicago and other major cities they will help clean up church buildings and the slum communities they serve and staff day camps, vacation church schools, recreation programs, tutoring programs, and other such.

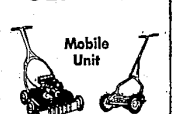
Last year 94 per cent of the 717 young people who made themselves the church's summer peace corps served in racially integrated situations. The vast majority made up integrated teams.

The summer work in mission areas of the United States is under the auspices of the United Presbyterian Board of National Missions in cooperation with the denominational Board of Christian Education and Commission on Ecumenical Missions and Relations and the Board of Christian Education of the Presbyterian Church, U.S.

In addition to work reinforcing the denominations' missionary programs in the United States and the West Indies, additional United Presbyterian and Presbyterian students will journey overseas for similar work under ecumenical auspices and take part in seminars in the United States and other countries that will help them understand the Church's mission in a time of rapid change.

Iseli is a graduate of Farmington High School.

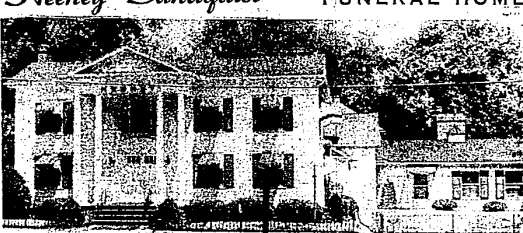
