Two Local Boys Serve in NATO Naval Exercise

Charles F. Curcio, seaman apprentice, and John D. Maas, electrician's mate third class, both of Farmington, took part in North Atlantic Treaty Organization exercises in European waters during the latter part of September.

Curcio is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Curcio of 31622 Shaw and Maas the son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Maas of 6275 Drake Road.

The two sailed on different ships: Curcio on the U.S.S. Tabberer and Maas on the U.S.S. Saratoga.

More than 200 vessels, with attached air support, from NATO countries took part in the operations, marking the first time since 1953 that forces under NATO have been engaged in large-scale combined fleet maneuvers.

Air and submarine opposition, anti-submarine warfare, aircraft carrier operations, simulated use of guided missiles and atomic weapons in offensive action, plus an amphibious assault landing were included in the exercises.
