## Local Woman Cured Of Cancer As Result Of Early Detection, Cancer Society States

Mrs. Peter Kobman, 57, of 27386 Halsted Road, Farmington, is living proof of the American Cancer Society's oft-repeated statement that cancer, if detected early enough, can be cured.

Mrs. Kobman, wife of an electrician in the Lincoln-Mercury plant at Wayne, who will retire in February after 35 years with the Ford organization, underwent an operation in 1949. Since that time, according to physicians who have examined her every six months, there has been no recurrence of the ailment.

THE CANCER SOCIETY, one of the health services made possible in this area by the Torch Drive, maintains that anyone who has been treated or operated upon for cancer and shows no recurrence after five years or more, is "cured."

Mrs. Kobman had both surgery and radium treatments. "Early detection is the important thing," Mrs. Kobman stated. "There is no need for fear if you go to the doctor early enough."

SEVEN DANGER signals are listed by the Cancer Society. They are:

1. Any sore that does not heal.
2. A lump or thickening, in the breast or elsewhere.
3. Unusual bleeding or discharge.
4. Any change in a wart or mole.
5. Persistent indigestion or difficulty in swallowing.
6. Persistent hoarseness or cough.
7. Any change in normal bowel habits.

The American Cancer Society does not insist cancer patients. It does, however, encourage establishment of adequate cancer control facilities. It maintains information centers to provide the public with information concerning cancer, and service centers to loan many sickroom devices needed by cancer patients. It also trains volunteers in serving cancer patients.

## Finishes 5-Month U. S. Navy Cruise

Donald D. Robinson, yeoman seaman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Robinson of 33518 Longwood Street, Farmington, returned to Norfolk, Virginia, the last of September aboard the attack transport USS Rockbridge after completing a five-month cruise in the Mediterranean.

During the five months, the transport participated in fleet exercises and an operation with British, Italian and American combined forces.

Between operations the Rockbridge's crew visited the Island of Rhodes and Athens, Greece; Tripoli, Libya; Alicante, Valencia and Palma, Spain; Naples, Italy and Cannes, France.

The Rockbridge will spend two months undergoing major overhaul and repair at the Naval Shipyard at Portsmouth, Virginia, and then proceed to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, for refresher training before resuming operational activities in the Norfolk area.

ity kept low. This has been an important factor in determining the workers' income. The profit control was lifted this year, but other restrictions are paralyzing industrial incentives.

Old Methods

At the big diesel plant of Werkspoor in Amsterdam I saw heavy machinery being built with production methods discarded in American industry 35 years ago. A single crew of men start with the placing of the basic castings and completely build a generator or a diesel motor. The productivity rate naturally is low. Werkspoor had only 100 workers in mass production in its wide array of manufactured articles.

When I asked about the average wage of skilled workers, the personnel director had a ledger brought in. He thumbed through and stopped on a worker's record which he considered typical. I saw exactly how his last pay check had been made out, every entry. His wage for a 47½ hour week was 56.50 guilders (\$17.50); he received \$19.10 in his part of the workers' collective bonus, making a total income of \$23.60. Deducted from this amount was \$2.70 for income tax, \$1.45 for government pension, \$1.75 for his government health insurance, and 3 cents for government special assistance subsidies — a total deduction of \$6.86. This left him \$16.74 take home pay for the week's work.

And everything he purchases with his \$16.74 bears a stiff indirect tax. Subsistence foods are reasonably low in cost, his rent is kept low by government control, but other family expenses are about like they are in America, or higher. Medium grade nylon hose are \$1.25; men's suits, medium grade, \$45 and \$60; a woman's sweater, \$4.75. A 21" table TV set retails at \$350; a 14" set at \$260; a 2½ foot refrigerator at \$140.

Automobiles and other things which Americans consider necessities are out of reach of the average family here. There is only one car for each 268 persons and workers don't own them (one car for every 2 persons in America). There are 5,400,000 pedal bicycles — one for every two persons (including babies and grand-parents) in the Netherlands.

The Government's old age pension plan provides \$18 a month for a man retiring at age 65; and \$36 a month for a man with a family. All this added together — big government, economic planning, high taxes, low productivity, subsistence "security" and relative poverty — is what the Socialized Welfare State has delivered for the Netherlands.

POLITICAL BREEZES are stirring during the off-year with the bigger storms due next spring and fall.

Republicans are still looking for a party candidate for governor and are organizing to help re-elect Senator Potter in the face of rugged competition from the Democrats.

Democrats are working to make further inroads on the Republican majority in the legislature and already have had a two-day doorbelling financial campaign around the state.

While no one has said so specifically, Lieutenant Governor Philip A. Hart is the best bet to go against Potter with Governor Williams expected to seek his sixth consecutive term.

The only Republican to come close to announcing his candidacy to go against Williams is Representative George Sallade (R-Ann Arbor), a Young Turk leader in the House who would like more party backing.

"You can call me a probable candidate in the primary," he said.
