Allow Special Sparing Rights on Crystal Lake

A change in sparing regulations on popular Crystal Lake in Benzie county will be in effect this year. Sparing fishermen will be allowed to take whitefish, ciscoes, suckers and carp from Crystal Lake during a November 15-February 28 season.

This season formerly opened November 1, but the state Conservation Commission recently established the later opening date to give added protection to lake trout in Crystal Lake during the early part of November.

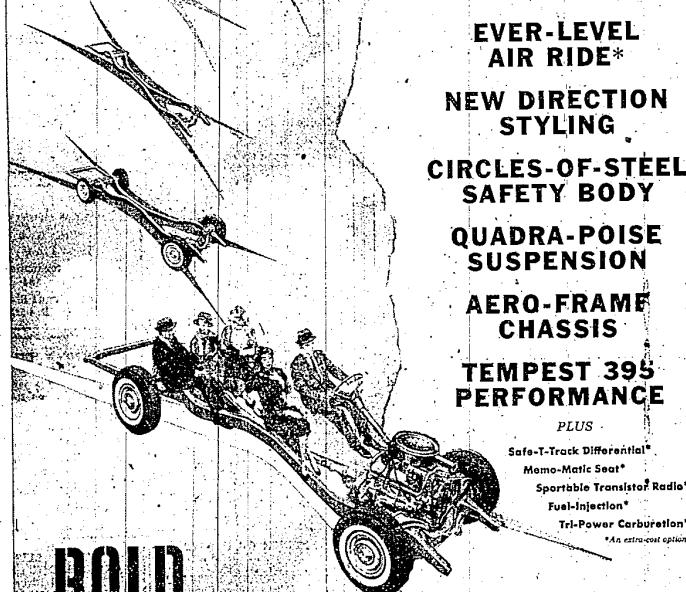
