

## Quail From Tennessee Downed in Michigan

A Columbian quail, apparently a visitor from Tennessee, was shot recently by a hunter in the upper peninsula.

The bird, wore a leg band identifying it as a bird released by the Tennessee Conservation Department.

The Columbian, or European migratory quail, is not native to Michigan but has been released in several other states on an experimental basis.

The birds are somewhat smaller than Michigan's bobwhite quail.

Game biologists from Michigan's Conservation Department are studying Columbian experiments in other states, but believe there is little chance the species could be established in Michigan.

"We are in the northern part of the quail range and the Columbian is not as hardy as our bobwhite," said R. A. MacMullan, in charge of research for the Department's game division.
