personnel it cannot do the kind of educational job it would like in the future.

National figures repeat the charge that the United States is turning out engineers and scientists at a rate slower than Russia. They say Russia's earth satellite was the result.

The situation revived the plan of Dr. Harlan H. Hatcher, president of the University of Michigan, some years ago that the nation should develop a pool of brain-power—much like the armed services.

This group would be the warriors in the field of science and technology.

Two new ideas have been proposed by Rep. William I. Bowerman (R-Lansing).

First, he suggests that students pay a greater share of their educational costs on a time-payment plan—reimbursing the state after graduation when their careers are underway.

When first proposed, the idea started a storm of protest from students and their parents.

Secondly, Bowerman suggested a free college education for the first two years. Students would stay at home and attend classes in their high schools, expand to include the freshman and sophomore years.

Classes would be conducted between 4 p.m. and 9 p.m. and during the summers.

He based the idea on a report which showed that 40 per cent of the freshmen enrolling in college fail to start their third year.

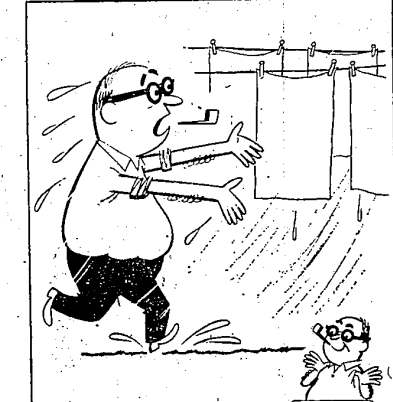
"I don't know whether these plans will work, but they will be considered by the 1958 legislature," he said.
