Though concluding regular season play, Clarenceville will still have one remaining game to play, a make-up contest with Northville. Farmington will be looking to add another victory to their impressive seasons record made only by one defeat and one tie.

Clarenceville will be hoping to mark up its first victory of the season. Last year the Falcons scored a 13-0 win over the Trojans. During the two previous rivalry contests, however, they were downed 7-6 and 7-0, respectively, by the much smaller Clarenceville school team.

### Holly Humbles Trojans 29-0

After holding a powerful Holly High team scoreless for the first period of play, the Clarenceville Trojans again faltered and again fell in defeat.

Showing a powerful offense at lack throughout the remaining three quarters, Holly racked up 29 points while holding the Trojans scoreless.

As a result, Southfield captured its first Inter-Lakes Conference crown and held Farmington in the runner-up position.

Playing commanding defensive ball throughout the first half, the Falcons also held the offensive edge. Twice the Falcons threatened to score, pushing to the Southfield 28 on one occasion and to the 24 on another, only to lose the ball on downs on each threat.

Dave Catherman, half back, was the principal ground gainer for Farmington with a total of 52 rushing yards. Clark's credit, followed by Neil Stevenson with 46 yards.

Tom Ridley, left half, ran the greatest distance in the game by rushing a total of 110 yards in 18 carries.

Although no score was picked up by either team in the first half of the game, Farmington dominated the play by gaining seven first downs to Southfield's two.

Also the third period was scoreless.

In the fourth quarter, Southfield began to edge its way 71 yards to the Falcon one yard line.

Jim Zureher, fullback, pushed his way across the goal to start a scoring streak for Southfield. Todd Grant made the conversion to set the score at 7-0.

After Southfield scored, the Falcons were forced to pass repeatedly throughout the rest of the game in an effort to counter the already-ahead Jays.

Tom Ridley ran 27 yards to score for Southfield after Ed Markey intercepted a Farmington pass. With the conversion kicked by Grant, the score was 14-0.

Ridley caught a 27-yard pass from Bob Filar to score the last touchdown of the game. Grant completed the conversion to end the scoring at 21-0.
